


<u>Vista</u> <u>Art – Lent 1</u>

<u>Atmospheric perspective</u> Atmospheric perspective is when objects further away are painted in lighter shades and objects closer are painted in darker, stronger tones.

## What is landscape art?

It is art that shows natural scenery such as mountains, valleys, trees, rivers and forests. Some modern landscape art also includes cityscapes.

## <u>Glossary</u>

Landscape – a view or picture of an area of land.

Technique – an activity that requires skill to complete.

Tone – a lighter or darker version of a colour.



Viewfinder – a frame that isolates a small part of a landscape.



<u>Colour Wheel</u> The colour wheel is split in half into warm and cool colours. Warm colours make you think of sunlight and heat whereas cool colours make you think of water and the sky.
