Cyberbullying

Cyberbullying (also known as online bullying) is any form of bullying that takes place online and causes harm or distress to a person or group of people.

Think about how hurtful your words could be when writing something online.

If you think you might have written something mean, you should say sorry and remove the comment if you can.



<u>Digital Citizens</u> We should all try to be good digital citizens. In order to do this we should do the following:

- be kind and respectful to others online;
- report any unkind behaviour to a trusted adult;
- keep personal information private;
- do not reproduce anybody else's work and say it is your own without a citation.

<u>Glossary</u>

citation - a way to avoid plagiarism by giving someone recognition for the work they have done if you have used their ideas in your own work.

digital citizen - is being a part of an online or digital community.

personal information - any data that can be used to identify a specific person, such as full name, birthday, address or school.

plagiarism - taking someone else's ideas or work and pretending that they are yours.
