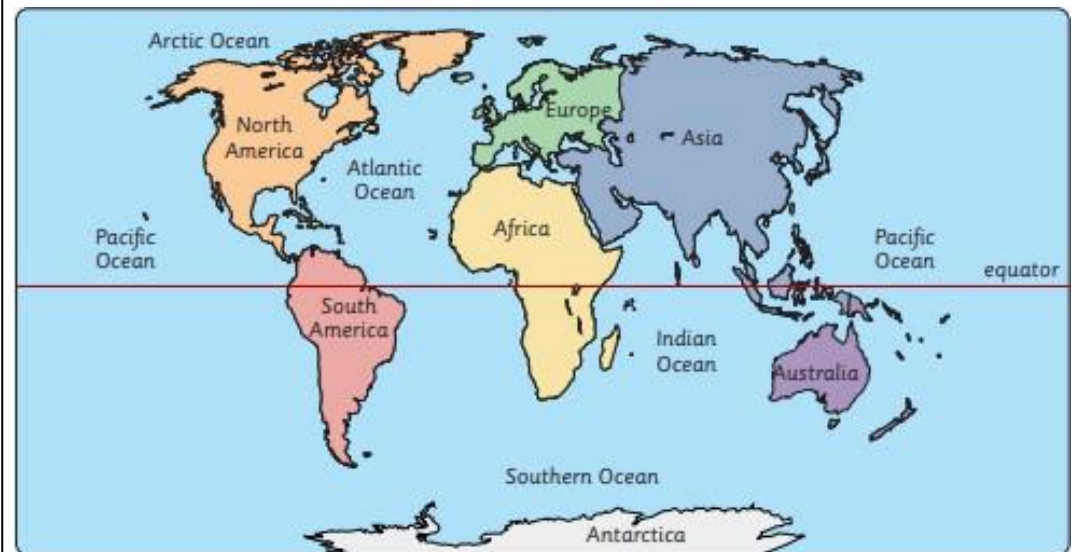

Maps:

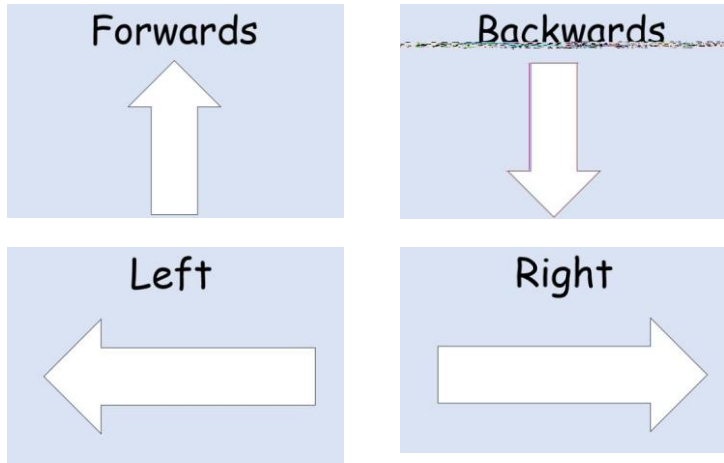
A map is a drawing of an area of land or sea that has usually been drawn from above. This map shows the seven continents and five oceans of the world.



The red line around the middle is the equator. The warmer areas of the world are closer to the equator and the colder areas of the world are further from the equator.

Directional Language:

Directions can help us to move around or to follow a route on a map.



Positional Language:

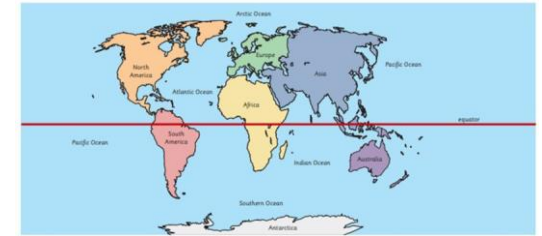
Positional language helps us to describe where things are in relation to each other.

Continent: One of seven of the world's areas of land.

Equator: An imaginary line that runs around the middle of the world.



Ocean: One of five of the world's areas of water.
