CLASS NEWS

EYFS

This week in Reception, we will be building on our celebrations topic by continuing our learning about Diwali and taking a look at some of the celebrations children in our class take part in at home. We will also be learning about Remembrance Day and creating art to help us remember the people who help to protect our country. In maths, we will be learning about 2D shapes with a focus on circles and triangles. Finally, in RE we will be learning about the Jewish celebration Hanukkah and exploring our big question 'What is Hanukkah?'

Year 1

This week in maths we will be naming, sorting and creating patterns with 3-D shapes. In English we will be learning about nouns and using these to write a character description. In RE we will be learning about the religion of Judaism and will hear the story of the family of Abraham. We will be naming parts of the body in science and ordering events on a timeline in history.

Year 2

This week in Year 2 we are continuing to write about our class book. We will be describing characters using descriptive language and using past tense verbs so that we can write in the correct tense when something has already happened. In maths we are continuing to add and subtract and we will be adding and subtracting across 10 using our number bonds to help us. Please continue to practise your number bonds to 10 at home as this will help you with your learning. In RE we will be starting our other faiths topic on Judaism where we will be learning about how they celebrate the sabbath called Shabbat. In history this week we are learning about Neil Armstrong and why he was a significant person in our time.

Year 3

This week in maths, we are using the formal method (column method) to add and subtract 2- and 3-digit numbers with exchanges. In English, over the next few weeks, we are going to be using the book 'Stone Age Boy' as a stimulus for writing a historical narrative and diary entry. This week, we are focusing on becoming familiar with the story, writing expanded noun phrases and using 'show, don't tell' to convey emotions. In RE, we begin our 'Other Faiths' topic of Judaism, where we learning all about synagogues. In history and our Stone Age topic, we are arranging events from the past in chronological order, and in science, we are describing the function of the skeleton and muscles. We have our first Spanish lesson this week,

learning to count to 10 in Spanish – ask your child about the song they have been learning to help them! Please have a look at our Year 3 class page, which has the recent knowledge organisers with the key information your child will be learning this term. It also has the current home learning which is uploaded each week.

Year 4

This week in English we are planning our own historical narrative set in the Viking Age. In Maths we will be completing our addition and subtraction unit by looking at inverse operations and different methods of subtraction. In History we begin our Invasion topic and what happened after the Romans withdrew from Britain. In Science we will be exploring what sound is. We begin our Other Faiths topic in R.E as we explore what the Torah is and why it is significant to Jewish people.

Year 5

This week in English we will be writing character descriptions for both Mulan and her father. Alongside this, we will also be writing a setting description of Ancient China. In maths we will be learning about division, and will be dividing using the bus stop method. In History we will be learning about bronze and the significance this played during the Shang Dynasty. During our RE lessons this week we will be exploring why and how Jewish people celebrate Passover and also the importance of the Sedar plate during Passover. During Science we will be learning about the solar system, in PSHE we will be exploring discrimination and in French we will be asking and giving our names.

Year 6

Year 6 will be extending their narrative writing, based on the book- Goodnight Mr Tom. This links closely to our History topic, Britain at War. We will be introducing the topic by discussing the question, "What is war?" In Maths we will be continuing with fractions: finding common denominators, adding and subtracting fractions. Judaism will be our focus in Religious Education for the next two weeks. In Science we will be studying how light travels moving onto understanding how we see.

Introduction of Fixed Penalty Formal Warning from September 2023

From September 2023 we have decided to take the decision to request that the Local Authority issue a Fixed Penalty Notice where unauthorised absence exceeds 15% in a six-week period.

If you wish to seek approval for any request of absence for your child(ren) from School, then you must apply in writing to the Head of School, at least four weeks in advance of the requested period. (Please request a form from the school office). You should only remove your child(ren) if the absence has been authorised, and notified to you in writing by the School. Any exceptional circumstances must be clearly set out in the written request to the Head Teacher who will consider each case upon its merits.

If you then choose to take your child out of school during term time and it is not deemed to be exceptional circumstances and/or has not been approved by the School, then this will be coded as an unauthorised absence and a Fixed Penalty Notice will be issued for the period of absence. The law states that, where there are unacceptable levels of attendance, schools may request that the Local Authority issue a Fixed Penalty Notice

The law states that, where there are unacceptable levels of attendance, schools may request that the Local Authority issue a Fixed Penalty Notice following the legal framework:

- Section 7 of the Education Act 1996 places upon parents a duty to ensure that their child receives efficient full-time education either by regular attendance at school or otherwise.
- Where a child is a registered pupil at a school and the parent fails to ensure that child's regular attendance at school the parent is liable to be prosecuted for a criminal offence under section 444 of the Education Act.
- In some cases, where this duty is not being fulfilled Section 444B of the same Act empowers the Local Authority to issue a Fixed Penalty of £60 per parent, per child, which will increase if the fine isn't paid within the first 21 days to £120
- Failure to pay a Fixed Penalty may result in further legal action being taken against you.

ALL fines are retained by the Local Authority and the school does not receive any of this. We will continue to work with families to support as much as we can with attendance and further information can be found in our school attendance policy on our website. Should you wish to discuss this matter further, please contact the school office to make an appointment.

Parent Teacher Association (PTA)
