CLASS NEWS

EYFS

This week in Reception, we will begin our new topic 'Once upon a time'. On Wednesday, we will be having a fairy-tale dress up day to ignite the children's interest in the topic. In phonics, we will continue learning our set 1 sounds and blending them to read. In maths, we are learning about numbers 1-5 and finally, in RE we will be continuing our other faiths topic, continuing our learning about the Jewish festival of Hanukkah.

Year 1

This week in maths we will be recapping addition within 10, practicing a range of methods to aid us to find the answers to number sentences. In English we will be writing our own versions of 'Peace at Last'. In RE we are continuing to learn about Judaism and will hear the story of how Moses led the Jewish people to freedom. In history we will learn about how people spent their time in the 1950s and in DT we will investigate ways of joining materials.

Year 2

This week in Year 2 we are going to be innovating our class story in English. We will be creating our own story maps where we will be changing the characters and the things that the character draws with a magic pencil. In our maths learning we will be adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers using objects to help us solve the different calculations. In history we will be finding out about the great explorers that have had an impact on the world. We will be finding out what they did and what impact it had. In DT we are going to be practising chopping, cutting, mashing and peeling different vegetables. In our RE learning we will be continuing to learn about Judaism and what they do during Shabbat.

Year 3

This week in maths, we are using the formal method (column method) to add and subtract 2 numbers with exchanges. It is also Maths Week England and the theme is 'Three is the magic number' so we will be investigating and doing maths work around the number '3'. In English, we will be planning and writing our own historical narrative based on the book 'Stone Age Boy'. In RE, we are creating a Jewish stained-glass window, thinking about what we have learnt about the Synagogue, and then recognising and describing the ways in which the Synagogue helps the Jewish community. In History, we will be using the 'Investigate Loan boxes' from the Lincoln museum to learn more about the tools of the Stone Age and examining various artefacts. In science, we are exploring the structure of the bone and in PSHE we are celebrating anti-bullying week.

Year 4

This week in English we are finishing our historical narratives based on the Vikings. In Maths we begin our new topic on area and will find the area of rectilinear shapes, exploring different ways we can do this. In Science we will be investigating how sound waves travel and in History we will be

looking at what happened during the early middle ages. In R.E we are continuing our Judaism topic and describing what a bar/bat mitzvah is as well as the importance of the Torah. In DT we will be writing a report about what the Vikings ate using our research from last week.

Year 5

This week in English we will be writing our own narratives, based on the story of Mulan. We will be trying hard to include lots of the Year 5 writing features in our own writing too! In maths we will be starting a new unit of learning focusing on fractions. This week we will be recognising equivalent fractions and converting improper fractions to mixed numbers. In History we will be learning about the hierarchy system in the Shang Dynasty. During our RE lesson this week we will be learning that Jewish people only believe in one God: The Shema. During Science we will be learning about the rotation of the Earth and Moon around the Sun, in PSHE we will be recognising and challenge stereotype and in French we will be asking for and giving our names.

Year 6

In English this week, Year 6 will be developing dialogue between characters and writing a narrative based on WW2 evacuees. In Maths we will be continuing with adding and subtracting fractions. Last week pupils thoroughly enjoyed using mirrors and torches to explore how light travels. This week we will be learning about 'how we see.' We will be looking and discussing the causes of WW2 in History. In Religious Education we will describe how and learn why Mitzvah is celebrated by Jewish people.

Introduction of Fixed Penalty Formal Warning from September 2023

From September 2023 we have decided to take the decision to request that the Local Authority issue a Fixed Penalty Notice where unauthorised absence exceeds 15% in a six-week period.

If you wish to seek approval for any request of absence for your child(ren) from School, then you must apply in writing to the Head of School, at least four weeks in advance of the requested period. (Please request a form from the school office). You should only remove your child(ren) if the absence has been authorised, and notified to you in writing by the School. Any exceptional circumstances must be clearly set out in the written request to the Head Teacher who will consider each case upon its merits.

If you then choose to take your child out of school during term time and it is not deemed to be exceptional circumstances and/or has not been approved by the School, then this will be coded as an unauthorised absence and a Fixed Penalty Notice will be issued for the period of absence. The law states that, where there are unacceptable levels of attendance, schools may request that the Local Authority issue a Fixed Penalty Notice

The law states that, where there are unacceptable levels of attendance, schools may request that the Local Authority issue a Fixed Penalty Notice following the legal framework:

- Section 7 of the Education Act 1996 places upon parents a duty to ensure that their child receives efficient full-time education either by regular attendance at school or otherwise.
- Where a child is a registered pupil at a school and the parent fails to ensure that child's regular attendance at school the parent is liable to be prosecuted for a criminal offence under section 444 of the Education Act.
- In some cases, where this duty is not being fulfilled Section 444B of the same Act empowers the Local Authority to issue a Fixed Penalty of £60 per parent, per child, which will increase if the fine isn't paid within the first 21 days to £120
- Failure to pay a Fixed Penalty may result in further legal action being taken against you.

ALL fines are retained by the Local Authority and the school does not receive any of this. We will continue to work with families to support as much as we can with attendance and further information can be found in our school attendance policy on our website. Should you wish to discuss this matter further, please contact the school office to make an appointment.

Parent Teacher Association (PTA)
