CLASS NEWS

EYFS

This week in EYFS, we will be focusing on the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We will make wanted posters and story maps. In maths, we will be learning about the composition of numbers to 5 and how we can add smaller numbers together to make a new number. In RE, we will begin our new topic 'Birthdays' by role-playing birthday parties, reflecting on our own experiences of birthdays and recognising that birthdays are a celebration of the day we were born.

Year 1

This week in maths we will be recapping subtraction within 10, practicing a range of methods to aid us to find the answers to number sentences. In English we will be reading Baby Bear's diary entry and writing in the past tense. We will explore the human senses in science, discover what life was like for children in the 1950s and discuss ways we are unique in PSHE. We will also get the opportunity to take part in a Road Safety workshop this week.

Year 2

This week in Year 2 we are going to be writing our own stories about a magical object of our choice. It might be a magical stone that transports us into the future or a teddy that when we cuddle takes us to a magical castle. We will be using what we have learned this term to describe with adjectives and interesting openers to interest the reader. In maths we will be using the column method to add and subtract when crossing the tens barrier. In science this week we will be learning about what happens in the human life cycle and the different stages within the human life. In our PSHE this week we are learning about what makes us special and unique. We are also starting our new RE topic which is focusing on the Christmas story of Mary giving birth to Jesus.

Year 3

This week in maths and English, children will be completing some short assessments on their learning so far this year. It is nothing for them to worry about and will take place as part of our normal lessons. It will let me know how much progress they have made, and what areas to focus on going forward. In maths, we will also continue to work on addition and subtraction by adding 2- and 3- digit numbers, and subtracting 2-digit numbers from 3-digit numbers. In English, we will be editing our historical narratives and exploring the features of a diary. In RE, we begin the new topic, Visitors, by asking the big question – Are visitors always welcome? We also learn about the Jesse tree and design some symbols of our own. In history, we move on to the Bronze Age and learn about how the discovery of metal improved people's lives. During science, we investigate and explore the importance of joints.

Year 4

This week we will be identifying features of a non-chronological report in preparation of writing our own about the Vikings. In maths we begin our multiplication and division unit. We start out Advent topic in R.E by exploring the gift of friendship and describing ways we can prepare for Jesus. In History we are exploring why the Anglo Saxons invaded Britain and the impact this had and we will be explaining how we can hear sounds in Science. We will take part in National Youth Funday on Friday by joining in with some hymns and prayers.

Year 5

This week in English we will be completing some independent writing. We will also be exploring a range of different newspaper articles and will be identifying the different features they have. In maths we will be continuing our learning about fractions and will be comparing and ordering them. In RE we will be starting our new Advent topic. During our lessons this week we will be discussing our ideas and questions about waiting hopefully and will also be making links between Advent as a time of waiting and Christian beliefs and actions. During our History lesson we will be answering questions about everyday life in the Shang Dynasty and in MFL we will continuing to read and write giving our names. During Science we will be learning about why we have day and night and in RSHE we will be thinking about our different gifts and talents

Year 6

Please send in any *unwanted* clothes that we can cut up for our Make Do and Mend DT unit of work this term. Next week Year 6 will be completing our narrative work on Goodnight Mr Tom. We will then begin an historical narrative based on a video clip called The Piano. In Maths, we will be moving into multiplying and dividing fractions. History will be based on the role of warring nations during WWII. We will begin Religious Education exploring expectations for Christians during Advent. In Science we will be investigating shadows and why they are the same shape as the object they cast.

Introduction of Fixed Penalty Formal Warning from September 2023

From September 2023 we have decided to take the decision to request that the Local Authority issue a Fixed Penalty Notice where unauthorised absence exceeds 15% in a six-week period.

If you wish to seek approval for any request of absence for your child(ren) from School, then you must apply in writing to the Head of School, at least four weeks in advance of the requested period. (Please request a form from the school office). You should only remove your child(ren) if the absence has been authorised, and notified to you in writing by the School. Any exceptional circumstances must be clearly set out in the written request to the Head Teacher who will consider each case upon its merits.

If you then choose to take your child out of school during term time and it is not deemed to be exceptional circumstances and/or has not been approved by the School, then this will be coded as an unauthorised absence and a Fixed Penalty Notice will be issued for the period of absence.

The law states that, where there are unacceptable levels of attendance, schools may request that the Local Authority issue a Fixed Penalty Notice following the legal framework:

- Section 7 of the Education Act 1996 places upon parents a duty to ensure that their child receives efficient full-time education either by regular attendance at school or otherwise.
- Where a child is a registered pupil at a school and the parent fails to ensure that child's regular attendance at school the parent is liable to be prosecuted for a criminal offence under section 444 of the Education Act.
- In some cases, where this duty is not being fulfilled Section 444B of the same Act empowers the Local Authority to issue a Fixed Penalty of £60 per parent, per child, which will increase if the fine isn't paid within the first 21 days to £120
- Failure to pay a Fixed Penalty may result in further legal action being taken against you.

ALL fines are retained by the Local Authority and the school does not receive any of this. We will continue to work with families to support as much as we can with attendance and further information can be found in our school attendance policy on our website. Should you wish to discuss this matter further, please contact the school office to make an appointment.

Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

St Mary's are looking for volunteers to set up and run the school's PTA. The main role of the PTA is to build strong working relationships among parents, teachers and schools, in support of students, at schools where the PTA raises a significant portion of the school's discretionary money. In recent years the PTA have worked really hard in raising money for our school by organising events such as Discos, musical evenings, Christmas & Summer Fair and a BBQ at Sports Day are just some of the events that have been held over the years which have helped to pay for new books for the library, compost and plants for Gardening Club, Pantomime at Blackfriars, breakfast for SAT's, Year 1 dressing up outfits, Autism items and Year 6 diaries and pens. PTA events cannot happen without volunteers to run and organise them. The PTA committee is a small group of parents who always welcome new members to help co-ordinate the events diary.
