

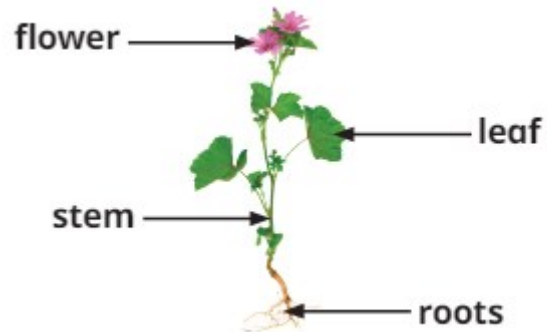

Plants

A plant is a living thing that usually grows in soil.



Seeds

A seed is the part of a plant that can grow into a new plant.



Where does our food come from?

Plants grown by farmers are called crops. Here we can see vegetables growing in a field.



Farmers plant seeds to grow crops. When the crops are grown, farmers sell them to people to eat.

How can we care for our planet?

It is everybody's responsibility to look after the world. Looking after the Earth helps humans, other animals and plants.

Reusing and recycling helps the Earth.



Reusing:

Reusing is taking old items that you might consider throwing away and finding a new use for them.

Recycling:

Recycling is the process of converting waste materials, that would usually be thrown away, into new materials and objects



Glossary



Crops: Plants which are grown for food.

Farmer: A person who grows crops.

Fruit: A part of a plant that can be eaten, and contains seeds.



Growth: When a living thing gets bigger.

Plant: A living thing that usually grows in soil.

Recycle: To change rubbish into a material that can be used again.

Reuse: To use again or use more than once.



Seed: a part of a plant that can grow into a new plant.

Vegetable: A part of a plant that can be eaten, such as a stem, root or leaf.
