#### **Class News**

#### **EYFS**

Welcome to EYFS! We have loved welcoming the children to their first year at school this past week; we have all settled into our new classroom brilliantly. The children have had a fantastic first week back at school. We've introduced ourselves to each other and have said something that we are most excited for the year. We started the school year by reading 'Elmer' discussing how we can embrace our differences, Elmer learns that his friends love him for his uniqueness. In RE we have begun our topic of 'Myself', discussing why we are precious.

#### Year 1

Welcome to Year 1! We have had a fantastic first few days back and we've already begun settling into our new classroom and learning our new classroom routines. In maths we continue to recap our maths learning from EYFS and practice our number bonds to 10. In English we will explore our class story 'Where the Wild Things are' by acting out the story, sequencing the story and creating actions for our story map. In RE we will continue our topic 'Families' by discussing ways that God looks after us. In PSHE we will conduct an experiment to investigate the importance of using soap and in geography we will create our own maps of school.

#### Year 2

Welcome to your final year of KS1 education! Last week we learnt all about new beginnings in RE which is very apt for the children (and me a new member of staff at Saint Marys!). In English we have been looking at story maps which is in the home learning this week to create a story map about something exciting you did over the summer holidays! We will be looking at improving our stories with good grammar and interesting adjectives. In maths we are consolidating number facts from Year 1 and building on this with accessing place value of numbers within 50. We will build on our musical knowledge of pitch in voice from last week to play along to a song using an instrument. In RE we are understanding more about prayer. This year our class PE day will be every Thursday.

#### Year 3

Welcome back Year 3 and it is fantastic to have you all back in my class. In English we are starting to create story maps for our class texts about an alien invasion. We will be looking at using more interesting adjectives and descriptive language. In maths we are going to be learning about place value and how to partition numbers over 100. In RE we are starting our topic on 'Homes'. In this topic we will be writing about rules we think are important at home and giving reasons as to what God did to show us it was important. In geography we are going to be using an atlas to find different countries and facts about the places.

#### Year 4

Welcome to Year 4! We have had a wonderful first week back and have settled into our new classroom brilliantly. This week in English, we will be beginning our unit about stories from another culture. We will be focusing on the text 'Gregory Cool' and identifying key themes within it. In maths we will be representing and partitioning numbers up to 1000 in different ways. In RE we will be exploring the difference between the Old and New Testament as well as retelling the story of Abraham and giving reasons for his actions. In geography we will begin to look at plotting on a map and in science we will be exploring the differences between herbivore, omnivore and carnivore teeth.

#### Year 5

Welcome to Year 5! We have had an excellent start to the school year and settled into our new classroom well. This week we've written our class charter, where our rights and responsibilities were written and agreed upon by the whole class. We've started our Geography topic "Investigating our World" where the children did a fantastic job of finding local landmarks on ordinance survey maps. The whole class made a very energetic start to speaking French, where they learn how to say numbers 1 to 10 and say "hello". Our English work this term will focus on science fiction, using the planet Pandora, from Avatar, as our stage to write stories, letters, reports and poetry. Maths will start off looking at numbers and place value and RE has started by exploring the idea of "Who am I" and how our ideas link and can be guided by scripture.

#### Year 6

As a class, we have excitedly discussed how pleased we are with the way in which our school year has started. I trust pupils have shared this excitement with you at home. You have every reason to be proud of your child(ren). This week we will be completing our baseline tests for Maths and Grammar. In English we will begin our unit on writing a Science-Fiction narrative. Maths will include revision of place value and numbers up to 10 million. In RE we will be exploring and discussing God's unconditional love and how this has a positive effect on our lives and beliefs. Our Geography unit will begin with identifying and describing the features of the Earth. In Science we will be introducing our topic on Evolution and Inheritance by discussing fossils.
