#### **Class News**

#### EYFS

In EYFS this week we will be focusing on our class book 'The Rainbow fish' where we will explore different aspects of the book. In maths we will be continuing out topic match, sort and compare. In RE we will be talking about our topic of 'myself' begin to recognise that God knows and loves me.

#### Year 1

In Year 1 this week we will be writing setting descriptions using Miss Rose's favourite words – adjectives! In maths we will be focusing on numbers to 20. In RE we will be thinking about what makes a happy home and in science we will describe the feel of different objects. In art we will be using pastels to recreate a famous portrait and in geography we will be drawing maps of our classroom to use to practice positional language.

#### Year 2

Year two have been enjoying writing about our class book 'on the way home' by Jill Murphy. We are using the text to help us describe interesting features about settings and characters. We are using knowledge from year one to identify where the verbs nouns and adjectives belong within a sentence. In maths as we finish off flexible participation within 100, we will be moving onto comparing objects and numbers based on their place value. In geography we will continue our work on maps whilst in science we will be looking at the features of a bird. In RE we will wonder about how we can come close to God in prayer.

#### Year 3

This week in Year 3 we will be continuing to write about our new class text about Pink and Blue. We will be describing the characters using what they look like with similes and expanded noun phrases. We will also be describing the setting of Pink's home planet and outer space where she has her adventure. In maths we are continuing to learn about place value with numbers to and over 100. We will be using hundred, tens and ones to help us complete our work. In geography we will be looking at different geographical features such as flatland and coastline. In our RE learning this week we will be continuing our topic about homes.

#### Year 4

This week in English, we will be continuing our unit about stories from another culture. We will be exploring similes and metaphors, writing a setting description and revising direct speech rules. In maths we will be representing and partitioning numbers up to 10,000 in different ways. In RE we will be exploring the stories of Joseph and Ruth, giving reasons for the way they acted. In geography we will be looking at using four figure grid references to locate places on a map and in science we will be exploring the differences between herbivore, omnivore and carnivore teeth.

#### Year 5

This week in Year 5 we will be continuing our place value learning in maths. We will be exploring powers of 10, counting forwards and backwards and rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. During our English lessons we will be writing a character description for a character from Pandora, and will be planning our own sci-fi stories. In RE we will be exploring and reflecting upon our own personal uniqueness and in PSHE we will be learning about the benefits of a balanced healthy lifestyle. Towards the end of the week we will be investigating tints, shades and tones in landscapes.

#### Year 6

This week we will be continuing our Science Fiction writing with a focus on settings. We are very excited about this unit because it involves a Chimp lost in space and the video clip we are basing this on has a catchy song. In maths we will be comparing numbers, rounding and calculating below zero. Our RE will be developed around the Beatitudes and God's unconditional love for us. In science we will be discussing how investigating fossils helps scientist better understand the world in which we live. In Geography, we will be understanding time zones around the world.
