

RSHE Parental Consultation analysis October 2024

- 36 responses
- 97% understand what their child will be taught and when after reading the information in the Parent Consultation Tool about the content of 'Life to the Full'.
- 100% of parents are comfortable with the Catholic ethos of the programme.
- 100% of parents understand and accept their role is as the 'first educator' of their child on matters related to teaching human sexuality.
- 97% of parents trust school's judgment in delivering this programme.
- 100% of parents approve of their child learning the names of external genitalia in KS1.
- 100% of parents are happy for their child to be taught about sexual intimacy in Year 6, in a way that is respectful of Catholic beliefs.
- 100% of parents understand how to submit a request to withdraw their child from the elements of sex education that are not taught as part of the compulsory national science curriculum after reading the RSHE Policy.
- Parents knowledge about the government's new framework for RSHE:
 - 41% parents rate their knowledge as 5-high
 - 34% parents rate their knowledge as 4
 - 13% parents rate their knowledge as 3
 - 5% parents rate their knowledge as 2
 - 5% parents rate their knowledge as 1-low
- Parent's confidence about talking to their child about relationships, growing up and sex:
 - 63% rate their confidence as 5-high
 - 22% rate their confidence as 4
 - 14% rate their confidence as 3
 - 3% rate their confidence as 2
- 50% of parents would like to be involved in reviewing the school's policy on RSHE.
- Parents would find the following useful:
 - 15% would like a parent meeting about the new guidance
 - 25% would like to look at resources to be used (already shared and given logins)
 - 13% would like a workshop on talking to children about RSHE
 - 20% would like a list of books that can be used at home
 - 24% would like Information about RSHE on our newsletter
 - 2% would like none of the above
- 50% of Y5/6 parents might be interested in attending an information session to find out more about RSHE at St Mary's.
