RSHE Parental Consultation analysis October 2025

- 91.6% understand what their child will be taught and when after reading the information in the Parent Consultation Tool about the content of 'Life to the Full'.
- 100% of parents are comfortable with the Catholic ethos of the programme.
- 100% of parents understand and accept their role is as the 'first educator' of their child on matters related to teaching human sexuality.
- 91.6% of parents trust school's judgment in delivering this programme.
- 91.6% of parents approve of their child learning the names of external genitalia in KS1.
- 91.6% of parents are happy for their child to be taught about sexual intimacy in Year 6, in a way that is respectful of Catholic beliefs.
- 100% of parents understand how to submit a request to withdraw their child from the elements of sex education that are not taught as part of the compulsory national science curriculum after reading the RSHE Policy.
- Parents knowledge about the government's new framework for RSHE:
 - -50% parents rate their knowledge as 5-high
 - -25% parents rate their knowledge as 4
 - -17% parents rate their knowledge as 3
 - -8.3% parents rate their knowledge as 2
- Parent's confidence about talking to their child about relationships, growing up and sex:
 - -50% rate their confidence as 5-high
 - -8.3% rate their confidence as 4
- 42% of parents would like to be involved in reviewing the school's policy on RSHE.
- Parents would find the following useful:
 - -8.3% would like a parent meeting about the new guidance
 - -25% would like a list of books that can be used at home
 - -42% would like Information about RSHE on our newsletter
 - -25% would like none of the above
