Saint Mary's Primary School was first established in 1861 on Saint Mary's Church grounds. It was established to educate the poor children of a large Irish community that settled in Boston in the late 1800s. The school then moved to our current site in 1983 and is now known as Saint Mary's RC Primary Academy.

It has always been a popular school with a family atmosphere and an excellent reputation for attainment, behaviour and the support that we give to our families and children.

Research-based, innovative, effective teaching and learning strategies are implemented to ensure an effective curriculum, that builds on prior learning and supports the needs of all pupils.

Our school is a vibrant, inspiring, dynamic and technological learning environment, where children's learning achievements are celebrated and shared. Our beautiful grounds are used to inspire learning in and outside the classrooms and offer trim trails, sports pitches, and large open, grassed areas surrounded by trees.

Our creative, child-led EYFS areas include sensory gardens and sheltered play for all weathers. Our libraries are well-resourced, imaginative and inviting, inspiring our love of reading.

Our curriculum

Our aim is for every child to reach their potential as a unique, well-rounded individual and as a valuable citizen in our local, national and global community based on a Catholic Education that firmly places Christ at the centre of all aspects of school life.

We need to ensure that every child, no matter what background they're from, is fully prepared for the next stage of their education. It is essential that the children in our school have excellent communication skills, and this is a key feature of our curriculum.

We ensure that our pupils are fully prepared to thrive in the different curriculums offered by our various feeder schools in the area. In Boston, children have a choice of schools through a selective system.

We deliver The National Curriculum (2014) for all children and as a Catholic School, our RE curriculum is at the heart of what we do here at St Mary's and addresses wellbeing beyond the National Curriculum.

Finally, PE is of vital importance to our children. Here they can access a variety of experiences and learn new skills which will support them in growing into healthy, resilient young individuals that can make informed lifestyle choices.

Teaching and learning

Our teachers ensure that every lesson is planned so that pupils can be challenged and supported whatever their ability. Teachers track pupils' progress carefully and use this to inform their day-to-day and medium-term planning. Every class is supported by a teaching assistant who provides small group, individual support and challenge.

The school's curriculum is planned and sequenced so that new knowledge and skills build on what has been taught before and towards those defined endpoints, through retrieval practice and curriculum quizzes.

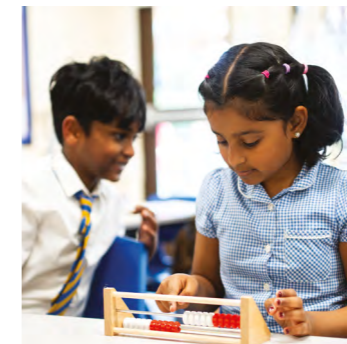
Developing the whole child

Our curriculum is enhanced through additional opportunities to engage in individual and group activities. These include:

- **Instrumental music tuition**
We offer, piano, drumming, violins, choir, singing, wind instruments.
- **Engagement in achieving national awards**
- **Parish and community work**
- **Sporting events and competitions**
Such as netball, orienteering, hockey, capture the flag and cricket.
- **Trips, visits and inspirational visitors**
These include museums, the seaside, aquarium, local area visits, trips to London and the Year 6 residential to Derbyshire.
- **Ownership of Charity work**
We support Local charities such as Centre Point, Cafod, Mission Together, MacMillian and Children in Need.
- **Wraparound care with a wide variety of clubs of interest for children to attend**
Such as sports clubs, cookery, drama, Eco warriors and film club.

Working with parents and carers

At Saint Mary's we greatly value working with parents/carers and respect and appreciate your opinions and contribution to continuing school development so that we can provide our pupils with the best possible education. Before starting school in the reception year, there will be an opportunity for new pupils to visit their class and parents/carers to attend an information meeting where they can ask any questions they may have. We offer parent workshops to support your child's learning as well as ESOL classes for parents who are new to English. If a child starts mid-year, there is an opportunity to meet the headteacher or senior, look around our school and meet their teacher.

Parents are encouraged to take part in our parent's association and charity events. Throughout the year parents are invited into school to share and celebrate their children's work and support various school and community events.

We want our parents/carers to feel as happy, secure and well-informed as possible when handing over their child to us.
